On the evening of February 24, 2025, Lydia Lenz passed away peacefully with her family present at the age of 90.

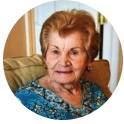

Lydia and her family came to America in 1953. Lydia married husband Jacob (Jack) Lenz in 1959, and gave birth to 3 children, Anita, Michael and Ron. Lydia was a devoted wife to Jack and unfortunately at the young age of 39, Jack was diagnosed with cancer and passed just a few short years later at age 41. Her business was so successful, she was able to pay for her children's higher education.
